Revelation 21:2-7



THE CANON OF THE MASS

Eucharistic Prayer A

At the appropriate time following the words of institution, the People say the Memorial Acclamation:

Priest Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith,
People **Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.**

The Priest continues the Prayer, chanting its conclusion:

Priest ...by him and with him and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.
People **Amen.**

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Priest breaks the Bread, after which she says

Priest Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People **Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.**

After you receive the host in your hands, please step to the side, allowing for good social distancing, remove your mask, consume the host, replace your mask, and then return to your seat. If you are not baptized, or if you prefer, you may receive a blessing from the Priest; to receive a blessing, simply cross your arms over your chest. If you would like to be baptized, please speak with a Priest after the Mass. Gluten-free hosts are always available.

The People at home are invited to pray this prayer.

In union, O Lord, with your faithful people at every altar of your Church, where the Holy Eucharist is now being celebrated, I desire to offer to you praise and thanksgiving. I remember your death, Lord Christ; I proclaim your resurrection; I await your coming in glory. And since I cannot receive you today in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood, I beseech you to come spiritually into my heart. Cleanse and strengthen me with your grace, Lord Jesus, and let me never be separated from you. May I live in you, and you in me, in this life and in the life to come. Amen.
